Mr. Joseph Murray is a tailor and has his shop in the first house on the main road coming from the the post office on the right. He also cultivates his land which is lower in the Wilson Valley.

He says his family is one of the oldest in Warsop, and all Murrays come from the same ancestor. His father was Simian Murray and died in 1938. His grand-father's name was Thomas. He does not know where his great-grand father came from.

The Murray family have on the main road in the vicinity of Joseph Murray houses: the next belongs to Kenneth Murray, whose father Samuel died not long ago. It is a handsome house with verandah and painted. Across the road there are two houses belonging to David Murray. Again at the right side there is William Murray's shop who rents the house from his father in law Stanley Guy who has next door a house painted and with verandah.

Joseph Murray says his family have land in the Wilson valley.

His wife Julia Bailey is the sister of Lucius Bailey.

His son is teacher in Troy. He is often seen in Warsop and takes active part in village life/cricket &/

One of his daughter is in Kingston training for midwifery.

In his tailor work-shop Mr. Murray has a little glass cupboard where bread is kept in sold. There are also shingles for the house he wants to built. His small house is next to his workshop. He wants pull in down and built a new one. He also wants to open a grocery shop in future.

He is most interested in all different kinds of timber and showed me the timber used for the building of the work-shop. The walls are from pitch pine - imported. It is not suitable in Jamaica as it rots easily. Blood wood is used for a little antresol. Bullet tree is suitable for door frames., as well as cedar. Locos - a hard tree for floor. He says the price of mahogany is £8 for 100 sq. feet. He says that in the Baptist church the floor is made from mahogany and maho alternatively. It makes a beautiful pattern.
